HIS DESIGN ARTS

In recent years, how we view art and how art is made has changed radically. New technologies, global and cross-cultural collaborations have given rise to new and exciting art forms. Art and design now permeate almost every aspect of modern culture - from the appliances we use at home, to the mobile technologies resting in our pockets.

The Design Arts Department aims to bridge the gap between concept-tocreation in our students, instilling them with core skills required in bringing their ideas to fruition.

The Design Arts Department is made up of four core principles: Art and Design, Food and Nutrition, Textiles and Design Technology (further split into DT: Resistant Materials and DT: Graphic Design).



Art & Design

The foundation of all design begins with the elements and principles of art. In Year 7, young artists explore art styles like Expressionism, Batik and Pop Art, understanding how simple lines, shapes and marks can inform balance, adaptability and creativity. In Year 8, they acquire skills in tonal and perspective drawing by studying artists such as Picasso, Nunzio Paci and Frida Kahlo. Our Year 9s will take colours, textures and shapes a step further and bring food to life in a series of still-life, material, sculpture and portrait projects. IGCSE Year 10 Art students have started their GCSE with a skills based term. They have been exploring different mediums (subtractive charcoal drawing of fabric, coffee painting, watercolour, and acrylic) doing in-depth study of elements & principles of Art & Design. They have also visited the Art Expo 2019 to appreciate and analyse existing artists' works.





Design Technology

In Year 7 Graphic Products, students are taught how to conceptualise, design and manufacture Board Games. They digitise and visualise their work through advanced 3D modelling and augmented reality technologies. The Year 8 designers will learn to make authentic Japanese Shoji Lamps, showcasing the key techniques and methods used in workshops around the globe. Our Year 9s will be focusing on key skills in resistant materials by making a musical instrument, while the Years 10 & 11 IGCSE Design Technology students will work at producing commercial products for the real-world — such as perfume, chocolate packaging and functional lamps.

Our Year 13 designers are in the final stages of completing their personal design-and-make projects as part of the DT Product Design A-Level. We have students investigating and finding solutions for a number of exciting projects such as 3D printed modular footwear, portable hydro turbines, and portable emergency tools for vehicles to name a few.

Food and Nutrition

Budding chefs in Year 7 began their culinary career in Food and Nutrition learning about healthy, balanced and nutritious diets. This foundational knowledge set the tone for many of their practical experiments and cooking tasks throughout the year. Year 8 chefs will learn about international cuisine and spices, aromatics and sensory evaluation formed an important part of their time making a wide assortment of dishes. Experienced chefs in Year 9 will be exposed to more in-depth knowledge about food science; and were tested through a variety of sizzling mystery challenges. IGCSE Year 10 Food Technology is the culmination of all culinary experience. The new Year 10s have been developing their core cooking (poultry skills by learning how to debone a chicken) and presenting skills (present and style a range of food to a fine dining standard). Our very first cohort of this exciting course are in their final year and are completing their food science coursework investigations. The coursework will conclude with the students cooking a 3-course meal and accompanying portfolio.

Textiles

It's been a busy half term in the textiles lab! The Year 7s have been honing their fine motor skills learning about applique to make fun Pop Art inspired cushions. In Year 8, the designers are learning more advanced techniques of sewing, embroidery and transfer printing while making eco-inspired pencil cases. Year 9s will look to apply their knowledge and skills of textiles – learning traditional and modern printing and dyeing techniques to design their own fabrics for some funky iPad cases. They will add a personal touch by using a computerised computer machine to embroider their cases.

Art for All: Exhibition & Auction

Titled 'Art for All', the exhibition and auction is organised by the Rotary Club of Utara Subang Jaya (USJ). This is a fundraising event to support the work of WeCare Journey, a non-profit organisation that supports and advocates for children and adults with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA).

What is SMA?

SMA is a neuromuscular disease that takes away the ability to move, walk, eat or breathe without assistance. It is the number one genetic cause of death for infants - in Malaysia, about 50 babies are born with SMA every year.

1 in every 50 people is a genetic carrier of SMA. If both parents are carriers of SMA, there is a 25% chance that when they have a child, the child will have SMA. There are 4 types of SMA, the most severe of which don't see 95% of babies living past their second birthday.

The Beneficiary

WeCareJourney strives to give patients and families the information and resources they need to live active, engaged, and hopeful lives. They work with government and related bodies, pharmaceutical companies, payors and the medical community to ensure there is inclusion and access to medicines. They also network with foreign SMA experts to build capacity in Malaysia to raise the standards of awareness and care.

The Art Exhibition & Auction

The art exhibition and auction is a great cause for HIS and our Design Arts Department to support. Some of our students will be exhibiting their art alongside the works of well-known Malaysian artists who have very generously donated their art work to be auctioned at the event.

We are privileged to have Ms Lim Meng Hong from the renowned auction house, **Christie's**, who will be flying in from Hong Kong to conduct the art auction.

Do drop by and support this great cause. Founders of WeCareJourney, Mr Edmund Lim and Ms Yap Sook Yee are also parents of a HELPian. As are Datuk Seri Jayasiri, President of the Rotary Club of USJ, and his wife Datin Seri Swee Lin.




















ECO-SCHOOLS
